
Objective 1 - After School Program

Objective 3- Develop Social Skills




Develop social skills to support appropriate peer relationships and social interaction.

Program Component: Application Process


The Application Process involves an in-depth interview between the Educational Support Team and the Parent / Guardian(s) of the student.

This meeting is held to discuss the child's academic progress, and any relevant IEP's, 504 Plans or PMP's.

Program Component: Development of Student Plans

Based on the **Parent Interview** during the "Application Process"

a Student Academic Plan is developed.



Student Plans are monitored for improvements and updated each report card marking period.

Program Component: Monthly Parent Meetings

Monthly Parent Meetings provide information on:

- Understanding and Supporting their child's academic development and abilities,
- 2. Available Programs and Services



When Parents are engaged in their child's education, they have a better understanding of what is being taught in school and the overall way of teaching and learning.



Program Component: Effective Evaluations

A **Self-Evaluation Tool** is used to assess the Program and ensure effective delivery of service.
